





Student Headcounts by Class Comparison of Fall 2013 and Fall 2017




Undergraduate Student Headcount and FTE: Fall and Spring Semesters 2013-14 to 2017-18






Fall Headcount to Fall FTE Ratio




Graduate Student Headcount and FTE: Fall and Spring Semesters 2013-14 to 2017-18






Fall Headcount to Fall FTE Ratio




Total Student Headcount and FTE: Fall and Spring Semesters 2013-14 to 2017-18







County of Origin of South Carolina Residents Fall 2017




State of Origin of US Residents Fall 2017




First-Year Retention Rates of New, Full-Time Freshmen Cohort Year Fall 2008 to Cohort Year 2016

Graduation Rates of New Full-Time Freshmen by Race/Ethnicity Cohort Year 2007 to Cohort Year 2013




