





#### Student Headcounts by Class Comparison Fall 2016 and Fall 2020







## Undergraduate Student Headcount and FTE: Fall and Spring Semesters 2016-17 to 2020-21













## Graduate Student Headcount and FTE: Fall and Spring Semesters 2016-17 to 2020-21






### First-Year Retention Rates of All New, Full-Time Freshmen Cohort Year Fall 2010 to Cohort Year 2019






### **Graduation Rates of New Full-time Transfers** Cohort Year 2009 to Cohort Year 2017
